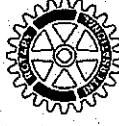

MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 19 BOARD MEETING.

Feedback from last week's Club Assembly was positive: board members feel we should have an assembly annually with the middle of the fiscal year being a good time for this meeting. Someone did feel we should have talked more about membership/attendance and our current trend of losing members. • Several of our members are behind in their dues and they are encouraged to get them in immediately. • On March 5, Governor Beverly Perdue will be our guest speaker. Reservations will be required and are being handled by Gayle Anderson and her folks at the Chamber.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

February 12 – We held a Club Assembly to discuss important club business. President Bill started the meeting by talking about the four things we've done exceptionally well this year:

- ✓ Cook School Partnership
- ✓ International Projects
- ✓ Rotary Foundation Programs

On the flip side, what can we improve on?

- ◆ Membership: we've lost fifteen members in the first six months of this fiscal year
- ◆ Benevolence: only 1/2 of our membership have made their commitment; your executive team has pre-selected areas/agencies we want to support with these funds

At this point in the meeting, committee chairs or their designee give 2-minute updates.

Cook School (Bill Park)

- * March 8-12 will be the Cook School Book Fair; each child will receive \$20-25 in Book Bucks to spend to purchase books they can keep.
- * We met at Cook right before Christmas but was unable to have the classroom parties due to inclement weather.

Gaines Scholarship Golf Tournament (Lynn Ebert)

- * June 11, 2010 at Salem Glen Golf & Country Club
- * The members will be asked to get teams together or to volunteer their time/services in some other way.
- * Earl "The Pearl" Monroe has committed to play in this year's tournament. Chris Paul has been contacted, and we hope his schedule will permit him to play.

International Committee (John Lewandowski)

- * Reynolda Rotary has a sister-club relationship with the Poznan Poland Rotary Club. In the past few years, we have provided matching grant funds for use with handicapped children.
- * We sponsored Thorns Craven as team leader on an outbound GSE trip to Scotland.
- * We have one Ambassadorial Scholar currently in Mexico City and one getting ready to leave for Spain.

Rotary Foundation (Michelle Kennedy)

- * She talked about the Shelter Boxes that Rotary International is providing as part of Haiti Relief. Each box contains ten-man tents, blankets and any other living essentials necessary during such hardships. She told about how we can donate funds in which Shelter Boxes will be purchased. Contact Michelle if you are interested.

Programs/Meetings (Barbara Cassidy)

- * All committee members were thanked for their work in lining up exceptional programs. Programs have been booked through April. We've got some special programs coming up – one of which is the Reagan High School Jazz Band.

Membership (Debbie Best)

- * Currently we only have one application in the membership process. We have lost fifteen members in the past six months, so all Rotarians are asked to be on the look out for good, quality potential Rotarians. Bring your friends to meetings – get them acquainted with Rotary. Gauge their interest; propose them as members.
- * Rotary does have a Classification system for their members. The membership committee will try to keep this in check, but don't worry too much about it – it's more important to have quality, committed members.

February 19 – Classification talks were presented by Debbie Cesta and Gerald Chrisco. Debbie went first and told of growing up in Long Island where she was the daughter of a chemical engineer, played the flute and graduated from high school in 1972. Debbie has a brother and sister, and her mom currently lives near Linville, NC. After attending the University of South Florida for two years, Debbie graduated from the

University of Arizona in 1985 with a liberal arts degree. She worked and lived in the Washington, DC area, but after three years, she moved on to Clearwater, FL. It was while living in Clearwater that she met her future husband – Jim. They were married in 1990 and son David made his appearance in 1997 (his 13th birthday was yesterday!). The Cestas moved to Winston-Salem 11.5 years ago when she took a job at SciWorks. They are members of Highland Presbyterian Church. Debbie said she is so happy and at peace living and working in the Winston-Salem community.

Gerald Chrisco began his life story at the age of 15-5 (this was 1972) when he was looking for ways to get money for a car and dating. He applied for a janitorial position with Budd Services, and the rest, as they say, is history. Following graduation from NCSU, Gerald continued working for Budd, even when he married LeAnn in 1979. In 1981, Gerald graduate from the Babcock Graduate School of Management (now called the Schools of Business) of Wake Forest University with an MBA degree. All these years, Richard and Joe Budd were very supportive of Gerald in his education and ministerial endeavors. Hopefully some time in the Spring of 2010, Gerald will be ordained as a minister of New Hope Presbyterian Church.
