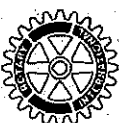

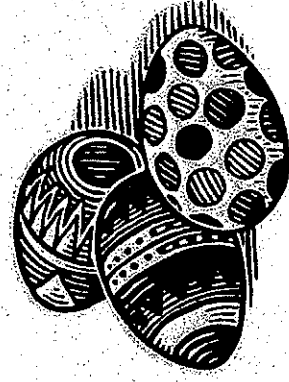

## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . . .

*March 12* – Jamie Albritton, Conductor and Artistic Director at Piedmont Opera was our speaker. Opera was invented more than 400 years ago in Florence, Italy. It is a “coming together” of all forms of art to tell a story. The word “opera” means “work” – as in works of art. In our City of the Arts, there are many extraordinary artists. Following Jamie’s humorous presentation, we got a sample of beautiful music from a vocalist and her accompanist.

*March 19* – Anne Marie Goslak from First Tee of the Triad was today’s guest speaker. She is a teaching pro at Oak Valley Golf Course and is in the Class A of the LPGA. She is Executive Director of First Tee, a youth organization that teaches young people ages 8-18 life skills. Using golf as the “hook”, life skills such as sportsmanship, honesty, judgment, and courtesy are taught. First Tee is now in 10 Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools and her goal is to grow and expand to all WS/FC schools. She encouraged us to volunteer or spread the word about this program. All it takes is 2 hours per week during the spring, summer and fall. Also, if you have any old – but still usable – golf clubs, this organization would love to have them.
