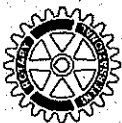

April 9 – Our own Mike Wells spoke to us about “What I Learned About Life on the Way to the Courthouse.” Years ago, Mike heard a speech by Senator Howard Baker on how people can live to be 100. Fast forward to a few years ago when Mike was to speak on Estate Planning to the Kernersville Rotary Club. He thought that a dry subject so instead spoke on how to live to be 100.
