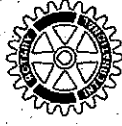

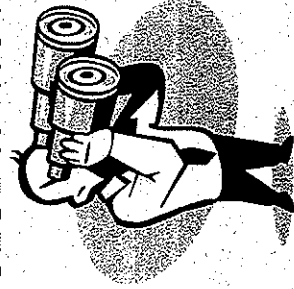

### MEMBERSHIP NEWS...

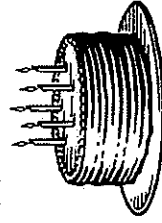

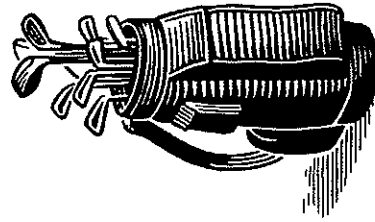

## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

April 23 – Michelle Portman spoke today about Harold Macklin and his architectural style in Winston-Salem during the early 1900s. Mr. Macklin worked in Winston-Salem from 1919 to 1947. He was either architect or associate architect for many projects, such as South Park School, Ardmore Elementary School, the original building at Summit School. The *Winston-Salem Journal* building, built in 1926, is a non-domestic colonial revival style of architecture. Not only were the exteriors important, but functionality of the interiors was a hallmark of Mr. Macklin's designs. Mr. Macklin was involved with the design in 1927 of the YMCA Building (on Spruce Street), in 1931 of Atkins High School, 1932 of the Chatham Building, and 1934 of the Angelo Building. During his 28 years in Winston-Salem, he also designed 30 residences, a hotel, an apartment building, and Bowman Gray Stadium.

April 30 – Richard Geiger, President of Visit Winston-Salem was today's speaker. He began its president in February of this year. Visit Winston-Salem is a non-profit that is the marketing arm for our tourism

authority. Their job is to sell Winston-Salem as a destination. They do this with a \$2 million budget and a staff of 11. "Heads in Beds" is their goal as it brings in new money to the marketplace. "Heads in Beds" is accomplished due to people coming into town to attend events and festivals. Visit Winston-Salem also advertises in trade publications, the internet and utilizes web marketing. Tourism is strong in North Carolina, especially since N.C. is the 6<sup>th</sup> most popular state to visit. Lost of cities – not just Winston-Salem – are having to reinvent themselves. It's a good time to be bold and do things differently. Winston-Salem is trying to grow their financial, medical, design, and nanotech fields.
