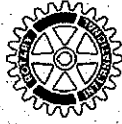

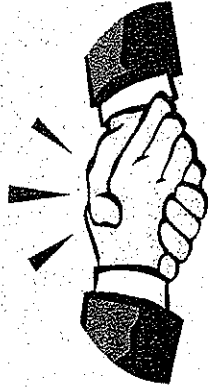

- STEVE POE** was missing at our meeting on May 14 due to attending District Assembly in Jamestown.

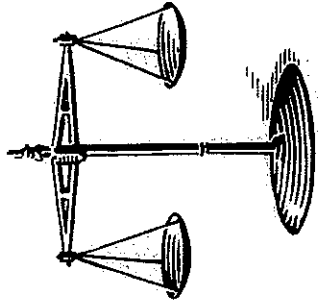

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

May 7 – Jim O’Neill, Forsyth County’s new District Attorney, presented a program where he touched on various topics. He has been an Assistant District



Attorney since 1997, but was appointed DA in 2009 upon Tom Keith’s retirement.

Jim’s specialty is cases involving women and children. The job of DA can be a miserable job, but he said it with a smile. What does a District Attorney do?

They prosecute criminal cases and works with the county commissioners on a budget that will ensure that programs/services that help put criminals away or get them the help they need remain in place. Jim offered some interesting – but very scary statistics:

- Three years ago, Forsyth County prosecuted more robberies than anywhere in the state. There are 25 prosecutors in Forsyth County.
- Forsyth County sent more habitual felons to prison than any other county in the state.
- Forsyth County prosecuted more drunk drivers.
- Conducted more trials.
- Forsyth County sent more sex offenders to prison than anywhere else in the state.

We Have Serious Crime!

The jail’s population is funded by us – the taxpayers. Did you realize that there are 500 sex offenders living in Forsyth County? With only ONE detective monitoring their whereabouts???? Jim said we – Forsyth County citizens – have been very lucky that no child has been snatched by an offender like you often see elsewhere in the country. Forsyth County has a “zero tolerance policy.”

May 14 – Tom Howe, the General Manager of UNC-TV, spoke to us today. Did you know that more homes in North Carolina have televisions than indoor plumbing? 54% of all households have 3 TV sets. 73% of all media use is during prime time, and that the use of the remote control is a male phenomenon. A typical adult watches 4 hours of television per day; a child 3-5 hours per day. Surprisingly, DVRs are not used that much. For the 7th year in a row, PBS is the most trusted institution in America. There are 11 transmitters across the State, and UNC-TV is licensed through UNC. Following some good questions, Tom encouraged us to financially support UNC TV.
