PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

June 4 – Peter Driscoll spoke to us about the art of Scrimshaw. Scrimshaw is the American whalers' art of engraving on ivory. It is truly an original American art form. He also brought along some sample of his work; they are truly outstanding.

June 11 – Hugh Quinn from the American Red Cross brought us today's program. The Red Cross provides relief efforts to approximately 200 families each year. Disaster action teams are on call 24/7. The Red Cross also provides these services:

- Emergency communication to military families
- Conduct training in babysitting, CPA, and first aid.
- Gets fire safety information out to young people (through the schools). They in turn take that information home to their families.

Red Cross blood drives collect about 28,000 units yearly – that's with about 800 blood drives. The United Way is a major supporter to the Red Cross, but they do accept individual contributions.
