June 25 – The Salvation Army Boys & Girls Club was today's topic by Ellen Doyle. Since 1992, Ellen has been on the Advisory Council. The Salvation Army was founded in 1865 by William Booth, but today is in 118 countries. The Salvation Army started in Winston-Salem in 1907. The Ken Carlson Boys & Girls Club is on Reynolds Park Road and opened in 2008. It serves 550 youth, ages 5-18. The International Boys & Girls Club is on New Walkertown Road. Buses pick up the kids from 17 elementary and middle schools, and provide programs from 2:30 – 7:30 p.m. each day. There are 5 areas of focus:

Character and Leadership Development
Education and Career Development
Health and Life Skills
The Arts

Sports and Recreation

At each center, kids can take part in various programs such as:

- Career fairs
- Health programs
- Tutoring
- Camping opportunities
- and the Music conservatory

The cost for a child to attend is \$410, but that covers the entire school and the summer. What a deal!
