PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

July 2 – Phil Smith, National Political Director for The Concord Coalition was today’s guest speaker. His topic: “The Federal Budget: An Overview” was a timely subject. The Coalition is a non-partisan group that tries to educate Americans about being fiscally responsible with the federal budget. An speaking of debt, the national debt is \$13 trillion. A couple billion dollars will be used to pay *interest* on that debt. Any income to the federal government normally comes in the form of income taxes. The government has mandatory spending on Social Security, Medicaid and Medicare, Child Nutrition programs, and Food Stamps. Discretionary Spending is considered for defense and non-defense programs. By 2044, 20% of the population will be over 65, so the government must figure out how to pay for them. It all boils down to Washington needs a wake up call from “We the People”.
