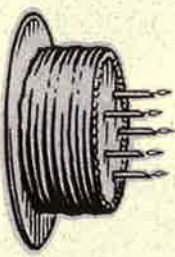

### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . . .

*July 16* – Matthew Troy, Executive Director and Maestro of the Winston-Salem Youth Symphony was today's guest. He began his musical career in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade while trying to impress a young lady by learning to play the viola. She left the music class but he stayed on. This year's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary partnership with the WS/FC schools and the Mary Stirling Program. Small ensembles from the symphony play before each kindergarten and 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes. Then, the full symphony performs an orchestral concert at Reynolds Auditorium. For many young people, this is their first taste of this kind of music. The program Fun with Fiddles is for every kindergarten student, while the Youth Orchestra Program has 150 families involved and all youth participants must audition. The Side-by-Side Series is a partnership where the youth symphony participates play along side the entire Winston-Salem Symphony.



*July 23* – Geoff Lassiter, President of the Winston-Salem Dash was today's guest. The citizens of Winston-Salem have been incredibly supportive on the team, and games this season have averaged 4500 per game. By season end, they anticipate that 325,000 people will have seen the Dash play during home games. Team stats todate:  
 57 W 39 L (season total)  
 32W 14L (at home)  
 14W 12L in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the season  
 140 games are will be played between April 8 and September 5. Play Off Games will be September 8 and 9. The team's batting average is 300. In addition to games, the stadium can be used for other things. Kevin Harvick Racing recently had their entire team for an outing; Prudential hosted 1000 people for movie night. Hopefully in late September or early October, there will be an outdoor concert, and they are hoping for 9,000 – 10,000 people to attend.
