## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .



August 27 – Wake Forest University's new men's basketball coach, Jeff Bzdelik, was today's speaker. Coach began his career at Davidson College and has coached for 32 years. He comes to WFU with a strong reputation for developing his players. Coach Bzdelik totally gets the competitive spirit in this area. He also recognizes that school is a 4-5 year commitment to a potential 50 year career. It was obvious from his

presentation that student athletes completing their education is critical. And yes, games can be won with students that are strong as well in the classroom. He applauds Reynolda Rotary's work in the community, but especially with Cook Elementary School. He continued on to say that we have a young team – 5 freshmen and 1 senior, so will probably be picked towards the last in the ACC standings. As a team, the Deacons have talent, but Coach Bzdelik want the

students to care more about the front of their jersey (school affiliation) than they do the back. Coach ended his presentation with some very good audience questions, such as "The Role of Agents to the Student Athlete" and "One and Done Mentality". Coach Bzdelik and his wife have a daughter who is a sophomore at WFU and a son who is a senior at the University of Colorado. Joining him today were several members of the WFU Athletic Department.

September 3 – Walter McDowell spoke about the Community Education Collaboration on "Why Improving the School Graduation Rate is the Entire Community's Responsibility and What YOU Can Do About It?" Walter was with Wachovia Bank for 35 years, and while he enjoyed his job, what he is doing now, he finds exhilarating! The Community Education Collaborative believes that success in public education is a shared responsibility – students, families, school system and the community. It's goal is to raise the awareness of education and graduation rates. 14.9% of students in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County School System live below the poverty level. It is a documented fact that children that live in poverty performed at a poorer level in school. Students that graduate from high school have a higher earning potential. If the higher graduation rate (90%) is achieved, it will lift the economy in Forsyth County by \$1.95 billion. Parkland High School and Philo Middle School were "test" cases to see how programs such as "Prep for Success", tutoring, mentoring, "Summer Success Academy," worked at these schools. Dazzling results! Students at Parkland earned higher test scores, so now, programs such as those named above will be added to more schools. During the 2009-2010 academic year, 1401 kids and their families were touched. About 400 kids were saved last year meaning that they either didn't drop out of school or that they were in middle school and made better progress and were promoted to the next grade level.

The **Triad Flight of Honor** is getting ready for the fall flying season! After our very successful flights in the spring, we have chartered three (3) flights with US Airways in the fall of 2010 on Saturday September 18<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday October 6<sup>th</sup>, and Saturday October 30<sup>th</sup>. As a service project of District 7690, our Rotary clubs have played a key role in the success of this program and have provided grassroots support for identifying and sponsoring veterans in your communities.

Many of our clubs have already designated support of veterans on our fall flights. In fact, the Rotary clubs in our district have contributed \$22,500 towards our fall flights, which makes it possible for 45 veterans to see and experience the WWII Memorial that was dedicated to them. In addition, we are working with the Rotarian Magazine to have a reporter on our October 6<sup>th</sup> flight to share with the Rotary world what great things we are doing in District 7690.

Unfortunately, we have closed out our fall flights having identified all our veterans and guardians for each flight. If your club would like to designate support for a specific veteran and/or a veteran from your community, we are now taking reservations for flights that will resume in the spring of 2011. As before, a \$500 donation will sponsor a veteran and a \$1,500 donation (sponsorship of 3 veterans) will allow a club to reserve a guardian seat for \$200.
