"My first action was to mark the original corner of the Moravian survey team first securing the 100,000 acre Wachovia tract which became Winston-Salem (just west of Muddy Creek at Highway 158) in Clemmons. Kevin Frack, a local Moravian pastor and friend, who's uncle was one of the original eight surveyors, along with Robert Beroth of Clemmons Moravian Church, were recognized. Mr. Beroth, along with Rep. Bill McGee, a former mayor, will secure state recognition and National Historic marker as well."
