## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

February 21 - Mark Boyton, a local attorney who also takes part in the Little Theatre, gave a presentation on "Acting and the Little Theatre." Mark said that acting is like taking drugs. Once you get that "high", that feeling of being on stage, you can't get rid of it. Telling stories -- that's what we humans do, and theatre is just another way of story telling. No other event draws crowds that have no other things in common, except their interest in listening to stories that stir up our emotions. Mark then regaled us with stories from his acting experiences. It takes so much more than you see as an audience member to get a production ready. We were encouraged to continue our support of the Little Theatre, and he passed out information on the 2003-2004 season.

February 28 - The CEO of Targacept, Don deBethizy, was today's guest speaker. He brought a slide show about the U.S. Biotech Industry. The biotech industry is a very innovative, but risky industry. However, it's rewards can be huge! North Carolina is ranked 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> as a biotech center. North Carolina has 156 biotech companies with \$3 billion in sales and 18,000 employees. With outstanding research universities, 4 medical schools, and the largest research park, biotechnology is a natural fit for N.C. Don ended his presentation by giving us an overview of Targacept, which was founded in 1997 as a spin off of RJR. It currently has 67 employees with 1 approved product on the market.

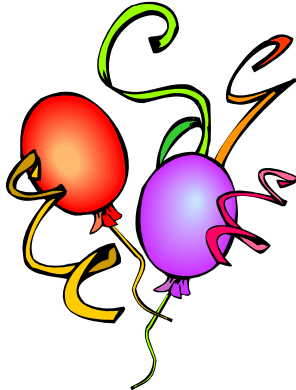
