## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

January 3 - President Warren led our 2<sup>nd</sup> Club Assembly. Committee chairs made brief presentations, bringing us up-to-date on the following: The **History Committee** will present our January 10 program. Rotary International is requiring every club in the world to have a **Centennial Project**. This project will should be a 3-year project, one that requires not only funds but hands-on, community service. Currently there are 5 suggested projects under consideration by the Centennial Project Committee. By the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of the year, the final project should be named. The **Benevolence Committee** reports \$13,928 contributed by 106 people. The **Community Service Committee** is looking for good projects that require the funds we've collected through benevolence contributions. The **Treasurer's Report** shows a balance of \$22,105 in the Benevolence Account and \$6402 in the Operating Fund. The Board voted to raise dues by \$15 per quarter, effectively with the January statements, which will be going out in a few weeks. Our **International Committee** is busily working on 2 projects. The Poznan Club (our sister club) is currently deciding on what medical equipment/supplies/journals they need, so we can determine how best to help them. Also, the GSE Team from Nigeria will be hosted by District 7690 for the time here. Reynolda Rotary's week to host the team is April 5-12. Families willing to provide home stays for a team member should contact a member of the International Committee. Also, company tours, dinners, etc. will be needed, so you can see there are many ways you can interact with the GSE Team. What a tremendous job our **Special Events Committee** has done! We've already had 3 social events: Rotary Night with the Warhogs, the WFU vs UNC football game, and our Holiday Luncheon. A spring cultural event is being planned; more information forthcoming. **Attendance** for this year has been running in the 72-73% range. Our goal for the year is 75% attendance. Our **Polio Eradication Committee** will officially kick off its campaign January 17. On that day, our program will be about polio from a polio survivor. Reynolda Rotary's goal is \$13,000, to be raised by May 31, 2003. We have increased our Paul Harris Fellows by 4, thanks to the **Rotary Foundation Committee**.
