January 10 - "The History of Reynolda Rotary -- The Middle Years" was the program, brought to us by Paul Sinal and Sara Smith. They are big part of our history as Sara was the 12th club president and Paul was the 13th. Paul began by recognizing Dr. David Burr, who was a founding father of Reynolda Rotary. Paul and Sara presented our program in game-show format. We had two teams; **Team Reynolda**: Bert Bennett (leader), Lloyd Barnhardt, Mary Preston Yates, and Wes Perry vs **Team Rotary**: Barbara Cassidy (leader), Rick Murray, John Lewandowski, and Don Hayes. Each team had to answer questions; each question was worth \$5 (total day's winnings being donated to the Benevolence Committee.) Some of the questions were: *Who was the 1st president of Reynolda Rotary?* **Pete Hondros**. *What current Rotarian lives, works, and commutes from New York City?* **Rick Wesley**. *Give 3 of the 4 countries that Reynolda Rotary has participated in with a GSE team.* **Norway, Denmark, India (4th was Japan)**. *How long has Lynn Ebert been our Executive Secretary?* **14 years**. *Where was the 1st meeting location of Reynolda Rotary?* **Silver Reflections Lounge of the Holiday Inn**. *Who sponsored Gary Strickland into Reynolda Rotary?* **Wayne Roquemore**. *Who has provided transportation for Reynolda Rotary sponsored GSE team visits?* **Ched Neal**. *What is the name of our sister club?* **Poznan, Poland Club**. What a fun way to reflect on the happenings' and history of Reynolda Rotary!

January 17 - Greg Chase, Chair of our Polio Eradication Committee spoke today about a disease that has been around for 5000 years, but that we hope to put an end to real soon! Greg can remember back to 1954 when people's contact was restricted, there were no swimming in public pools, and friends were no longer at school. He also can remember the crutches and the dreaded iron lung. Jenny Danielson, who was suppose to be our program today, is a polio survivor but she couldn't get her muscles to cooperate allowing her to get out of bed today. She will certainly be welcome to speak to us at another time. Greg continued by saying that India, Nigeria, Afghanistan, and Pakistan are some of the countries in the world that still have cases of polio. As Greg said, "polio is just a plane ride away." A country must be polio-free for 4 years to be certified as a "polio free country." The goal of Rotary International is to provide funds, which will be matched by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, so that the world will be free of polio by 2005 -- the 100th anniversary of Rotary. Every \$1 you give provides vaccine for 10 children. We've got an extraordinary challenge before us, but it is definitely time to rid the world of polio!
