PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

May 30 – Dr. Katy Harriger, Professor of Political Science at Wake Forest spoke today on "Looking Ahead to Election 2004: Factors Shaping the Presidential Election Process." She began by saying that she wasn't making any predictions to the election. It's 18 months off and still up in the air as to who could win. Dr. Harriger did tell us how the following 6 factors affect a presidential election: (1) Money, (2) Role of the Primaries, (3) Role of Public Opinion Polls, (4) Voter Behavior/Turnout, (5) Media, (6) Influence of Key Issues. Then, incumbency and its advantages or disadvantages were discussed. George W. Bush has in his favor: his party has won seats in Congress, no 3rd party challengers (as of now), and perceived as being successful in the foreign policy arena. Disadvantages that President Bush faces are the weak economy and national deficit. Following her presentation, we asked a question regarding the program to Sam Smoak. Upon his correct answer, he won 4 tickets to an upcoming Warthogs game. Thanks to Pete Fisch for providing those tickets!

June 6 – County Commissioner Pete Brunstetter was today's guest. He spoke today about the Piedmont Triad International Airport and FedEx. PTIA is owned and operated by the Piedmont Triad Airport Authority, which has 7 members. PTIA is financially independent and self-sufficient, with revenue generated by rental fees/charges. It's operating budget for 2003 was \$29.4 million. Currently, PTIA is working on plans to provide space for FedEx and a new runway that will be about 9,000 feet long. Currently a variety of tenants are at PTIA: the main building, cargo building, TIMCO, CESNA, Atlanta Aero and Piedmont Hawthorne just to name a few. PTIA has signed a lease with FedEx; FedEx could potentially have 23-24 flights in its 1st phase. The hub is scheduled to open in 2008, and not later than 2009.

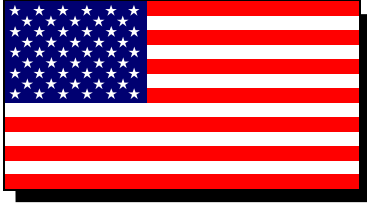
