March 21 – Wake Forest's Women's Championship Field Hockey Coach, Jennifer Averill, and senior Maria Whitehead spoke to us today. Jennifer formerly was a coach in the Big 10, but saw the light, and came on over to the ACC. She has been at WFU for 11 years, and to the Final Four 3 times. She and her team pride themselves on being a family and supportive of each other. Jennifer sees herself as a passionate person, with the ability to empower people to pursue what they are passionate about. People, both on and off a team, want to feel valued. Maria, one of the 3 seniors on this year's national championship team, spoke of what she's learned from Coach Averill, and how her passion has always been field hockey.

March 28 – To help us learn about Nigeria so we'll be better informed when the GSE team arrives, Dr. Simeon Ilesanmi, Associate Professor of Religion at WFU spoke on "The Promise and Perils of Human Rights Activism in Nigeria." Dr. Ilesanmi and his wife are providing one of the home stays for a GSE team member. Nigeria gained its independence in 1960, thus creating a challenge of creating unit in a newly-independent country. Ethnic, Regional, Economic and Political and some of the differentiations of the country. There are over 250 ethnic groups, but with the major portion of the country being Islamic, that become a unifying factor. Nigeria is a densely populated country where human rights have become crucial issues, along with redistribution of wealth – the newest "hot topic."

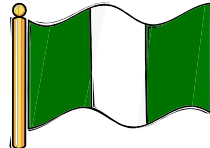

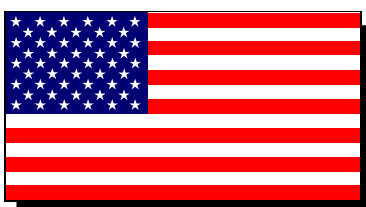
