ROTARY FACT. The Rotary Foundation in 1978 launched its most comprehensive humanitarian service activity with the Health, Hunger and Humanity Grants program. The 3-H Grants program is designed to undertake large-scale service projects beyond the capacity of individual Rotary clubs or groups of clubs. The first 3-H project marked the birth of what we now know as the PolioPlus program. Since 1978, almost 290 3-H projects have been carried out in 75 countries.

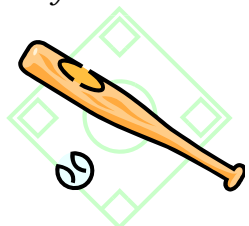
BILL ROSE retired from Cannon & Company effective April 15. Congratulations!

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

April 25 – **DASH** was the topic of Hunter and Sandlin Douglas. Downtowns typically are the heart of any city and downtown Winston-Salem is no exception. Young people often say there is nothing to do in Winston-Salem. Well, a group of young adults – ages 21-late 30 – have set out to show their peers just all there is to do. The DASH has a mission statement of “to attract and retain a younger generation to Winston-Salem through a vibrant downtown setting, ensuring a diverse social climate, economic growth, and a thriving arts and entertainment culture.” Events are held weekly at such venues as the Nissen Building and the Twin City Club. A proposal has been made that the City provide trolley service to local colleges on Friday and Saturday nights to assist that targeted age group to attend functions.

May 2 – “Take me out to the ball game . . .” by Steve DeLay, Chief Marketing Officer of Mandalay Baseball Properties. Also with him were Kevin Terry and Bill Harney. Mandalay owns 6 ball teams, and their role in Winston-Salem will be managing our new ballpark and team. The new stadium takes up 8 acres of 36 acres available. In addition to the new 5500 seat ball stadium and great parking, other local shops and restaurants will be built as Phase II of the complex. When the ball team takes the field next season, they will no longer be the Warthogs. A new stadium brings a new team name; the public is invited to submit their votes until later today. A new team name will be announced soon.
