PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

November 1- Mike Ford, Director of Student Development at Wake Forest was our speaker. His role is actually a human developmental role. His office develops and looks at various programs for college young people so that they become positive citizens of our community. Learning doesn't take place in just the classroom. Life experiences outside the classroom also are learning experiences. College life is very different now from say the 1960s. Administrators not only have to be concerned with educational issues, but health and safety. More students are engaged in political and social causes than ever before. Now, educational challenges revolve around character building, tolerance, social responsibility -- a must in today's educational process.

November 8 - Thomas McKim, Council for RJR Tobacco's Research & Development brought us today's program. RJR has had a Research & Development Department since 1907. Currently it is housed on Reynolds Blvd, has 3/4 million square feet of space, 130,000 square feet of that is lab space. Many smart folks -- such as scientists -- on its staff. Out of the hundreds of employees, 11 scientists are adjunct professors, 21 participate as reviewers or editors of journals, and R&D has received 400+ patents. R&D has 5 major functional areas: Product Development, Product Evaluation, Regulatory Toxicology, Brand Development Unit, and Process Engineering. Tom keeps his fingers in the litigation process with confidentiality issues, technology issues such as patents and ideas from scientists that must be led through the proper channels, import regulations, regulatory compliance functions, just to name a few. You would think that cigarettes are a simple product, but it takes lots to get them from the idea stage to store shelves and the consumer.

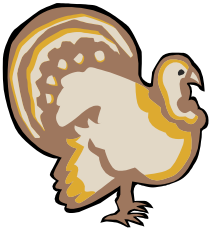
