President Emmett attends the Winston-Salem Club

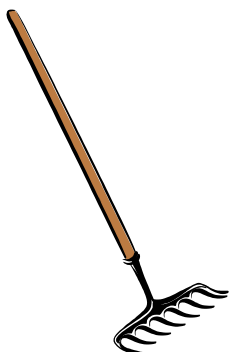
W-S Club Lunch	\$10.00

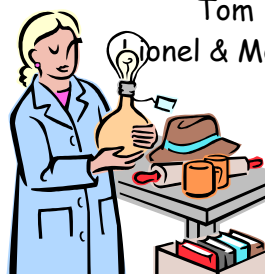
See Yardsale Pictures Below
