## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS . . .

October 18- Our own George Hoerr provided today's program. His classification talk provided us a glimpse into his world of plastic surgery. George, his wife Jeannie and their 3 kids have been in Winston-Salem since 1994. In addition to his local practice, he often does international work through Operation Smile. Plastic surgery falls into 2 categories: reconstructive and aesthetic. George said he finds his work very worthwhile and fulfilling. As his slide show indicated, when you can give a child a new life and better future through plastic surgery, that would indeed be fulfilling!

October 25 - What's WSJS radio without legendary Glenn Scott? Glenn began his career with WSJS Radio/TV in 1968. In 1978, he took over from Wally of the "Wayne & Wally Show", which started Glenn's career doing early shows. FM radio took over in the 1970's, causing AM to struggle until the 1980's when it began a recovery. Recovery was possible by the start of talk shows, along with news and information and the removal of music from WSJS, as well as many other AM stations. Of the top 10 markets today, 8 out of 10 are AM stations. WSJS has always focused on local advertising, and many of their advertisers are the same ones that began back in 1978 with Glenn. WSJS's local market area consists of Forsyth, Yadkin, Davidson, Davie, and Stokes counties. Clear Channel Communications, Infinity CBS (which owns WSJS), and Intercom are the 3 big station owners. There is almost no local ownership of radio stations any more. With the advent of digital and satellite, radio will continue to change and grow, but Glenn feels there will always be a place for local radio.
